

What is the MTP? Why does it matter to me?

The Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) is the plan for transportation improvements over the next twenty years. The plan is updated every four years by the Anchorage Metropolitan Area Transportation Solutions (AMATS). AMATS oversees the planning and programming of Federal dollars to improve the surface transportation system in the Anchorage Bowl and Chugiak-Eagle River.

The 2040 MTP will identify transportation needs that reflect our region’s changing population and demand for housing, land use, and transportation choices. The MTP will develop multi-modal recommendations for transportation improvements needed within the region over the next 20 years. By prioritizing transportation projects, the 2040 MTP will create a safe and efficient transportation network that will provide transportation choices, support the local economy, and enhance our quality of life.

How is the MTP updated?

The MTP will be developed in six phases, and public input plays a role in each phase. The graphic below shows the main phases and key activities:
